Update- M4RA & Incarcerated Youth: We recently trained Bluffton University Phonics students to plan lessons and implement 1:1 reading mentoring for Allen County Juvenile Detention Youth (JDC) who read far below grade level. In addition to the Allen County JDC, M4RA is implemented in all three of the Department of Youth Services prison schools throughout Ohio. Approximately 60-75% of incarcerated youth are identified youth with disabilities.
